### ST CUTHBERT C634-687

St Cuthbert's feast day falls on September 4<sup>th</sup> in the revised calendar. This year it is a Sunday, so he is omitted, but I thought I would say a few words about him, as the other patron saint of our diocese after Our Lady of Lourdes. Also, he has associations with Carlisle. St Bede recalls he visited the city at least once in his lifetime.

I am not going too much into his biography, apart from mentioning he was linked to Melrose, Lindisfarne and Hexham. His life was marked by the holiness, his preaching, his miracles and how he worked for the poor. He also led a very ascetic life which by our standards would have been very strict and austere (a fact often overlooked by the lovers of Celtic Christianity).

One aspect of his life that is not stressed too much was his missionary work, mainly in what is now the Borders, Galloway, Cumbria and Northumberland. He spent much of his time either ministering to the needs of newly founded communities or simply going out and being a missionary in pagan and sometimes hostile environments. He was noted for his kind and simple bearing when doing this but was not afraid to speak the truth in love. By his holiness and example, he won many people to the Catholic faith.

We ask the intercession and prayers of St Cuthbert for our diocese. It goes without saying we are going through difficult times. However, we also ask his aid as we need to remind ourselves, we are now missionary territory. Most people no longer know who God, or His Son Jesus Christ is, we seem to be turning into a "Godless" society. St Cuthbert's life and example can help us to see the way forward. Maybe as he brought people to know God, so we can imitate him and do the same.
