WHO ARE THE 4 EVANGELISTS?

On Tuesday 18 October we celebrate the Feast of St Luke. He is one of the four Evangelists; that is, he wrote one of the Gospels. **Luke** was a Gentile, a non-Jew, by birth from Antioch or Philippi. He never met Jesus face to face. He was well educated in Greek culture, and most likely a physician by profession. He became a companion of St Paul during the second missionary journey and remained with him up to Paul's final imprisonment in Rome. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles.

Matthew, son of Alphaeus was collecting taxes in Capernaum when he was called by Jesus. The Bible states that Jesus simply saw Matthew sitting in a tax collector's booth and said, "Follow me." Matthew discarded his previous life and followed Christ. He was appointed one of the 12 apostles and witnessed the life, preaching and miracles of Christ, as well as His death and resurrection.

Mark, or John-Mark, was a young boy when Jesus was teaching in Jerusalem. Mark's mother, Mary, had a house in Jerusalem that served as a meeting place for believers. The 'upper room' was probably in her house. Mark became a 'helper' to Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey. Later still he is associated with St Peter and the Church in Rome.

John, born in Bethsaida in Galilee was the son of Zebedee and Salome and brother to James. He is believed to be the youngest of the apostles and the only apostle who died of old age (94 years) rather than being martyred. He is also known as the Beloved Disciple. He wrote the 'Gospel of John', as well as four other books of the New Testament: the three 'Epistles of John' and the 'Book of Revelation'.
