Tuesday 1st Nov. is ALL SAINTS DAY - Holy Day of Obligation

In the Gospel for today we hear a parable that contrasts a Pharisee and a Tax Collector. Just for information:

Pharisee: the meaning of the name “Pharisee” seems to be: “to separate.” So a Pharisee is a “separatist” or a separated person. They separated themselves from the Jewish kings and their corruption, from the Romans and their abominations, from cultural assimilation to the non-Jewish way of life, and from the rest of the ordinary people who lived with little concern for strict religious principles. Most Pharisees were not priests but ordinary laymen. They believed in life after death and angels. They found themselves in opposition to Jesus because of their emphasis on the strict adherence to the Jewish Law, and their disdain for the rest of the people. Jesus welcomed the ordinary crowds and emphasised love in following the Law.

Tax Collector: These were wealthy men who paid for the privilege of collecting taxes in certain localities. They were often, but not always, Romans. Zacchaeus was a Jew and is called “chief tax collector”. These chief tax collectors employed local Jews to do the actual collecting of the taxes or tolls for them. It is probably just such a Jew who is referred to in the parable. As a class, the tax collectors were hated by their fellow Jews. This was almost inevitable. They represented the foreign domination of Rome. It is almost certain that they often overcharged people and pocketed the surplus. So they made themselves rich off the earnings and hard work of their own countrymen. Jesus chose one such man as an Apostle; Levi, also known as Matthew.
