LADYEWELL SHRINE, FERNYHALGH

On Saturday 21st September Bishop Paul is leading the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Ladyewell. Many people will attend and many altar servers from across the Diocese will form an impressive procession. A good number of our own servers will be there.

Devotion to Our Lady of Fernyhalgh reaches back to the 11th century. The name Fernyhalgh is thought by some historians to mean Ancient Shrine. In the time of the Anglo Saxons there was a shrine on this site which even in their day was considered ancient. The spring, still running to this day, was already used as a site for Baptism in the 7th century.

Tradition has it that in 1471 a wealthy merchant found himself in great distress during a passage on the Irish Sea. He made a vow that if he escaped danger, he would acknowledge the favour of his preservation by some remarkable work of piety. As the storm abated a favourable gale wafted the ship into the coast of Lancashire. He heard a voice which admonished him to seek a spot called Fernyhalgh and there to erect a chapel. Having found the spot, he discovered a statue of the Virgin Mary and erected a chapel. The spring became known as Lady Well, usually abbreviated to Ladyewell. An earlier chapel had existed on the spot and the merchant may have discovered its remains and built on top of it.

That 15th century chapel was destroyed during the persecution of Catholics in Reformation times, but Lancashire Catholics continued to throng there. Devotion to Our Lady Queen of Martyrs grew and flourished. Now a modest house and chapel mark the spot. Many relics of the Martyrs are displayed. Pilgrims come from all over the north of England, keeping alive a very ancient shrine.
