FEEDING THE 5000 – FEEDING THE WORLD

Throughout this year the Sunday Gospels are taken from the Gospel according to Mark. But beginning today and continuing for 5 weeks we leave Mark and read a substantial section of John. Chapter 6 begins with the miracle of the feeding of the 5000. We are familiar with this event: only 5 loaves and 2 fish were multiplied and shared with the people so that an enormous crowd ate as much as they wanted and there were still basketfuls left over. This miracle is also told in Mark (as well as Matthew and Luke), so why do we put Mark's version to the side and read John's? The reason is to be found in the way John writes his Gospel. John likes to link a long section of Jesus' teaching and preaching with a particular miracle. In this case the miracle is the feeding of the 5000; the teaching is all about the Eucharist, the Bread of Life. The miracle, which we read today, begins chapter 6; the rest of the chapter is spread out and read over the following 4 weeks. This gives us the chance each week to deepen our understanding of the mystery of the Bread of Life. Just as Jesus fed over 5000 people by lake Galilee, so today through the gift of the Eucharist He feeds us, and people like us in every part of the world. The miracle of the loaves was not done by Jesus simply to fill hungry stomachs; it was done to show that He intends to feed the starving soul of every one of His followers, including you. We call it Holy Communion.
